What is Operation Trojan Horse?

Operation Trojan Horse is a coordinated effort between the DEA and state and local law enforcement to combat the epidemic of prescription opioid and heroin overdoses across Pennsylvania and Delaware. Operation Trojan Horse offers intelligence resources, funding, and training with the goal of identifying illicit narcotic sources of supply in a timely manner.

I am a police officer, what is my role?

DEA can assist your department with information collected from overdose scenes. This information can be submitted on the DEA's Suspected Overdose Reporting form.

What will DEA do with the information that is submitted?

DEA will query the information provided through DEA, law enforcement, and open source databases.

What will I get back and how will it help my department?

Operation Trojan Horse provides state and local law enforcement with information on sources of supply and co-conspirators for further investigation. The submitting agency will be provided with the results of the DEA queries for their own investigative follow-up.

How does my department participate?

Operation Trojan Horse training is available upon request. The DEA will provide instruction on the collection, analysis, and submission of overdose information.
