In accordance with DOJ Policy Statement 1700.04, all contractors are subject to the following reporting requirements regardless of the position designation:

- 1. Immediately self-report any arrest in writing to his or her DOJ Contracting Officer's Representative (COR) and to the relevant DOJ component Security Programs Manager (SPM). The self-report must include the date of arrest, place of occurrence, circumstances leading to the arrest, name and address of police department or court involved, pending court date, and a copy of any documentation received during the arrest. Follow-up documentation is required to be submitted through iReport until resolution of the incident.
- 2. Immediately self-report any on or off duty allegations of misconduct to his or her DOJ COR and to the relevant DOJ component SPM. Reportable misconduct includes, but is not limited to, citations for driving under the influence or while intoxicated, failure to pay Federal or state taxes, disbarment and/or suspension, allegations of sexual misconduct, and any security violation.
- 3. Contractors must also follow their company's self-reporting policy.
