Traveling to the U.S. with Medication *Know Before You Go*

All travelers to the United States, whether citizens or visitors, must follow U.S. laws regarding prescription and over-the-counter medications regardless of foreign prescriptions. While legal abroad, prescription and over-the-counter medications are subject to confiscation and can result in severe penalties if not approved for use in the U.S. Additional state laws may apply.

You may bring a controlled substance into the U.S. for personal medical use or to administer to an animal that is traveling with you, if the following conditions are met:



Medication is in its original container



The medication label includes the drug's chemical or trade name and schedule symbol. If the chemical or trade name does not appear on the label, then the label must include the pharmacy/practitioner information, and a prescription number



Foreign visitors are allowed to bring up to 50 dosage units of controlled substances into the U.S. for personal use



Declare all medications to U.S. Customs and Border Patrol
